

**Double-degree BBA/CS students must read this entire document.**

In June of each year, double-degree students, who have met the progression by that time, are pre-registered by the Department for their BU courses and certain CP2xx and CP3xx courses. The purpose of such pre-registration is (1) to avoid time conflicts and (2) to guarantee you a seat in the courses. If you attempt to drop or change your pre-registered CP course, your seat might be immediately taken by others and you will not be able to register in that course at all. Double-degree BBA/CS students are **not allowed to change their pre-registered courses and lab sections.**

Students, who have **not** met progression by mid-June, are **not** and will **not** be pre-registered by the Department.

Whether pre-registered by the Department or not, all students are **required to verify** and complete their Loris registration as described below:

Once your Loris registration period begins (July 5-8 in 2022), you should check your Loris and note CP courses (if any), in which you have already been pre-registered by the Department, and, then, you **must** complete registration for the remaining courses so that **by mid-July** you are registered in **all the courses** for Fall and Winter, listed in the Academic Calendar: <https://academic-calendar.wlu.ca/program.php?cal=1&d=2412&p=5302&s=1000&y=83>

If students deviate from the [academic calendar course sequence](#) schedule, it will remain their responsibility to complete all the courses listed in the [academic calendar](#) for a given year by the end of the summer term. It will likely be impossible due to the course or seats (un)availability and schedule time conflicts. Academic Advisor will not be able to help with such requests.

The only permissible deviation from the academic calendar course sequence would be to take a CP course listed in the [academic calendar](#) for next year(s) ahead of its intended term/year (providing you have completed the course's prerequisites). If doing so, you are still required to have completed all the courses listed for a given year and obtaining 5.0 (or more) credits by August 31.

**Note:** Year-1 students are not allowed to take 200-level courses.

If you do decide taking courses ahead of the [academic calendar course sequence](#), it will be **entirely your responsibility to select CP courses available in a given term. Academic Advisor will not be able to answer such inquiries, nor will guarantee seats for you.**

If you have taken (or are currently taking) a course ahead of schedule and then, subsequently, are pre-registered for the same course by the Department, you should (obviously) drop that pre-registered course. Review your Loris course registration to make sure you are not repeating the same course. To see all courses offered in a given term: Open [Browse Classes](#) > **Select a Term** > Type in "Computer Science" or "Mathematics" and scroll down. For each offered course, you verify its [Prerequisites](#) and [Restrictions](#), watch [video-tutorial](#). If a Computer Science course does not show in [Browse Classes](#) and for all course availability and instruction mode inquiries, contact Physics and CS Administrative Assistant [pcs@wlu.ca](mailto:pcs@wlu.ca).

**Note:** CS majors (including double-degree students) are not allowed to take [CP202](#) because of the following Academic Calendar Exclusion: "Registration in BA or BSc programs in computer science or data science" <https://academic-calendar.wlu.ca/course.php?c=60213&cal=1&d=2412&s=1000&y=83>

Senior students are permitted to take up to two senior CP electives (for the entire program period) at other Canadian universities, including UW and online courses at Thompson Rivers University [tru.ca/distance/courses](http://tru.ca/distance/courses). Fully read the instructions [Taking Courses at Another University: LOP and UW cross-registration](#) before contacting the Advisor.
